The Clearwater Private Industry Council is completing the preparation for the North Central Idaho summer youth employment program for 1991. The purpose of the Summer Youth Employment Program is to provide economically disadvantaged youth 14-21 years of age with useful work experience and sufficient basic education to assist them in developing good work habits as well as with jobs at public and private non-profit agencies.

All youth will be assessed for reading and math skills and will be paid the federal minimum wage of \$4.25 per hour while they are working, or in class working on basic skills.

Job service, with offices in Moscow, Orofino, Grangeville and Lewiston, has been selected as the program operator. The Adult Basic Education Department of Lewis-Clark State College will provide teachers for the remediation of math and reading skills.
